Bible Memory Fellowship

What is this?

• This is a group of like-minded people who are committed to memorizing chapters or verses of the Bible and would like to meet occasionally to support each other's learning.

Why do we need a Bible Memory Fellowship?

- Sometimes when we gather together, we spend a lot of time having small talk, talking about politics, the weather, current events, dissecting the sermon, etc. But these conversations are not helping us prepare for difficult times.
- We need to have a focused time where we are helping and encouraging each other to learn and prepare for difficult times which may happen in the future.

How do we do this?

The most important thing about this group is that everyone should know that all the conversation should focused on learning and sharing Bible passages. You can use the following questions to start the conversation. You can use the same questions whenever you meet because there will always be something new to share!

- What new chapter have you learned?
- Has memorizing the Bible changed you in any way? If so, how?
- How did you feel after learning your first long passage? How did it feel to start the second passage?
- Have you shared Bible Memorizing with other people? Encourage people in the group to share Bible Memorizing (especially this strategy) with their friends.
- How or when did you use your memorized Bible passage in a practical way?
- Did you have a situation where you wished you had a Bible passage in mind to share?
 What Bible passage would have been appropriate in that situation?

Who can participate?

- Anyone who is interested in memorizing whole Bible chapters or verses
- Invite people of all ages to participate

When should we meet?

• You can choose a convenient day for your group or meet after church, or after prayer meeting

Where should be meet?

- You can choose to meet at one of the members houses, at a park, at a restaurant
- In a room after church or in the yard or parking lot of the church after service or prayer meeting

Suggestion:

• You can try meeting right after church service and ask everyone to BYOC (bring your own chair if you are meeting on the lawn) and BYOL (bring your own lunch), or you can ask to reserve a table at your church potluck for your Bible Memory Fellowship. Either way, you can meet to talk about Bible memorization during your lunch.
